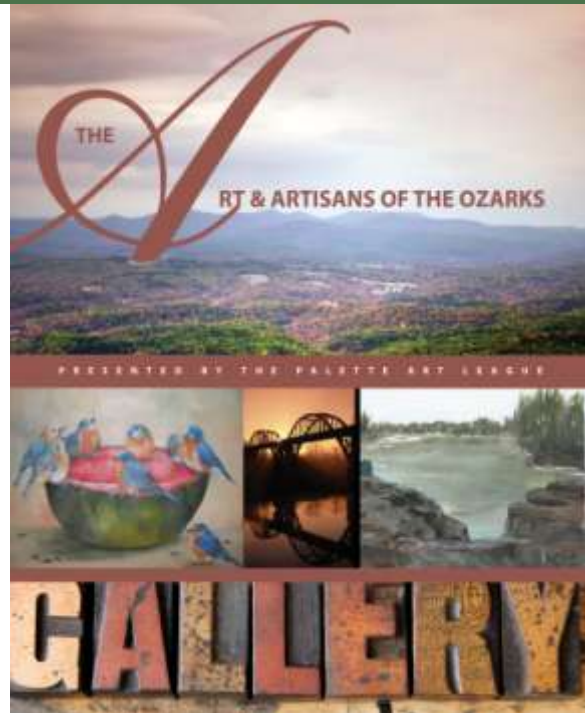
February Featured Artist

Carole Tormey Jones

Carole Jones of Yellville will be exhibiting at the P.A.L.'s Fine Art Gallery located in Yellville, Arkansas. Jones grew up in the horse country of Oyster Bay, Long Island, New York. Her love for all animals and ability to draw inspired her to attend, "The Art Students League" in New York City. Here, she was able to study illustration with Earl Martin, (Saturday Evening Post) and Steven Kid (New York Daily News). Jones also studied anatomy with Robert Hale and later furthered her education in England at Sir John Cass College, where she studied drawing, painting and illustration. She continued her study of the anatomy with the Royal Academy of London. After returning to the United States, Jones was asked to hang her work in the Country Art Gallery in her home town, Locust Valley, Long Island where her art work grew in popularity.

One woman shows include: The Country Art Gallery, Long Island, New York; The Noisy Oyster, New York, New York ; Palm Beach Gallery, West Palm Beach, Florida; The Black House, Searcy, Arkansas; The Cleburne County Art Council, Heber Springs, Arkansas; The Casements, Ormond Beach Florida, was a joint show with sculptor Gayle Hoone; Carole Jones is now expanding into a line of greeting cards, pet portraits and lots of other unique projects are in the works.

A reception to meet the artist, Carole Jones, will be open to the community on Saturday, February 13, 2010 from 2 to 4 pm at the P.A.L.'s Fine Art Gallery.

Pictured above is the cover design of **Art and Artisans of the Ozarks**, a compilation of artists' information and their works slated for release this summer. The Palette Art League (PAL) of Yellville, is seeking contributing artists for the upcoming publication, a full color, hardcover coffee table book to be available June 1, 2010, according to Dana Johnson, artist and vice-president of the organization. Johnson said the 160-page book will bring together participating artisans in the book designed to highlight the work of individual artists, and showcase the best the Ozarks has to offer in fine art in a variety of media. Submissions to be included in the publication are due no later than April 1, by artists who may choose from several different options to represent them and their art. Each option will include a biography and photograph of the artist and multiple artwork photographs in a portrait style layout, Johnson said. The completed book will measure approximately 9 by 12 inches. Each participating artist also will receive a one year PAL membership, an opportunity to use the

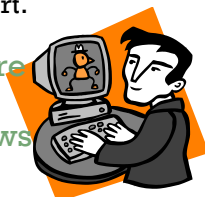

free photography sessions being offered to aid in submission of their work and information, a page on the art league website, a copy of **Art and Artisans of the Ozarks**, and the option to purchase more books a discounted price. Johnson noted the books will be available nationwide, though the PAL Gallery website and Amazon.com, gift shops, chamber of commerce in area towns, special events throughout the region and surrounding states, and through PAL members. Johnson stated excitement about the book is growing within the art community, and the Palette Art League, a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization, is hopeful that monies raised through sale of the creative collections books will assist in art projects offered through the gallery, and help defray building and operational expenses.
